

There are few places like Harpers Ferry – a mecca for those who want to experience scenery worth traveling across the Atlantic to see and to learn from and honor a location that is imbued with bravery and big ideas that helped to shape both American and World history. It is a beautiful, magical place that is sought out for weddings, fall colors, summer activities, hiking, festivals, multiple National Parks and Heritage Areas and Storer College.

Ideas that took form in Harpers Ferry changed the world once, and they can do so again. As Carolyn and Jack Fleming, parents of Harpers Ferry resident Dr. Alexander

Fleming, shared in Thinking Places, the Thinkorium was "... a place to plan and formulate - to think!" When you read through the Flemings' book, you will see that, along with Bell, many other notable thinkers visited the Hill Top House Hotel, including Mark Twain and Carl Sandberg.

We want the future Hill Top House Hotel to be known as an "Ideas Place" that sets the tone that Harpers Ferry is the Washingtonarea destination


for some of the greatest minds and planners of today and tomorrow. This would be a place where great plans are made, such as the Bretton Woods Agreement or the Wye River Agreement. The places where these came to be, Mt. Washington Hotel and The Aspen Institute, are two of a handful of like places that include The Chautauqua Institute and Jerusalem's American Colony, the "oasis of neutrality," where General Allenby had tea with T.E. Lawrence, as reenacted in the Academy Award-winning movie, Lawrence of Arabia.

We believe an "Ideas Place" can flourish. Closer to West Virginia, some residents of the town of Middleburg. Virginia, fought against The Salamander Resort. Now, after experiencing a waterfall of changes, they embrace it. Why? Because the town and region have prospered from the vision of its owner, Sheila Johnson, who created the Middleburg Film Festival. This film festival, which takes place during a "shoulder" season, has become a draw for writers, producers, actors and film enthusiasts from all over the world.

Combining the inspiring location







Lovett's original living project. In our opinion, putting any lesser type of hotel in that location would be, frankly, a disservice to Harpers Ferry, its legacy and its rightful place in history.
